1. Tuna comes from the Spanish word *atún*, it and is a salt-water fish that is common in cold lunches.

2. Puma, a common wildcat of the Americas, and the word originated in Quecha.

3. Iguana, a wild lizard found in Central and South America, is a modification of the Arawak and Carib word *iwana*.

4. Cafeteria came from the Spanish word *cafeteria*, meaning coffee shop, and is a place where people eat.

5. Cargo comes from the Spanish verb *cargar*, meaning to load. Cargo means things that are loaded, like luggage.

What is the most common Spanish dialect taught in the U.S. and where does it originate from?
