What is the most common Spanish dialect taught in the U.S. and where does it originate from?

Standard Latin American is taught in the U.S., and it is also known as "Highland".

What is "trade winds" Spanish and how does it differ from other dialects of Spanish?

It is the third major type of Spanish spoken in the Caribbean, the coastal parts of Latin America, and in some parts of southern Spain. During the seventeenth and eighteenth century, the Spanish accent

in Andalusia and Madrid changed. People started dropping the final "s" sound on words, which made this dialect different from other dialects of Spanish. The Spaniards brought this dialect of Spanish to the Caribbean with them, and people are able to speak faster with this dialect.

How does Argentinian Spanish differ from other dialects of Spanish? Where is the origination and what makes it different?

Argentinian Spanish uses out of date vocabulary and grammar. Some meanings of words and pronunciations of words are different also. For example, they used "vos" instead of "tú." It developed in and near Buenos Aires and Uruguay, and it is heavily influenced by the Italians who settled in and near Argentina.

What is Castilian Spanish and how is it different other dialects of Spanish?

Castilian Spanish is from Madrid and northern Spain, and it never came to the New World. It has different pronunciations for "ci" and "ce." These are actually pronounced like "th". Also, "vosotros" is used to say "you all" in the Castilian dialect instead of "ustedes."
