List 5 words with Spanish origin and their meanings.

1. **Chocolate**- Nahuatl word xocolatl- a preparation of the seeds of cacao, roasted, husked, and ground, often sweetened and flavored, as with vanilla.

2. **Hammock**- extended stays in Caribbean ports- a hanging bed or couch made of canvas, netted cord, or the like, with cords attached to supports at each end.

3. **Comrade**- camarada- old Spanish for barracks, company, or roommate.

4. **Tomato**- corruption of the Nahuatl word tomatl- mildly acid, pulpy, usually red fruit

5. **Rodeo**- 19th century Southwestern United States- roundup of cattle.
